Did you ever wish you could spend a day or two on a real ranch? Well, you can do just that here at the Three Seven's (777), Christian camp and working horse and cattle ranch in central eastern Utah, bordered by the Manti-Lasal Mountains and the San Rafael Swell. There will be a variety of activities and sessions for the different age levels of kids ( and parents) that come.

Horses, cattle, and sheep will be the primary focus of this camp. Did you ever wonder why God calls people *sheep* in the Bible or why He speaks of bits in horses' mouths? And what's the significance of branding? Think you're tough enough to do some? Maybe you've never ridden a horse and would like to learn how, or maybe you'd like to try your hand at roping. Have you ever watched cattle or sheep dogs at work? Now that's something to see!

This is camp so be sure to bring all your own personal care items, a sleeping bag and pillow, and a jacket. We ask that your clothing be modest and appropriate. (Closed-toed shoes and jeans will work best for the activities.)

Rooms (4) in the lodge and bedroom cabins (3) are available upon a request, if you have small children or if someone in your family has special needs. Otherwise, you'll be staying in comfortable bunkhouses with bathrooms. Each bunkhouse (2 for guys and 2 for gals) has 11 bunks, so space is limited. You'll want to get your reservations in early or at least by May 15.
